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
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PERIPOLE® FINGERING CHART For SOPRANO - BAROQUE (English)





* Alternate fingering positions are indicated for $A^{\sharp} B^{\flat}$ and $C^{\sharp} D^{\flat}$. Use these positions when convenient or possibly for greater accuracy of pitch with some recorders. Alternate fingering positions for other notes may also be found by experimentation or reference to recorder books and charts.



HIGHER NOTES

*FOR GERMAN FINGERING SOPRANO RECORDERS

The difference between Baroque and German fingering recorders is primarily in the F, F# fingerings. The Baroque is more widely used and requires a forked fingering. Recorder literature is almost always written for Baroque fingering.
